Board member engagement

Characteristics of an effective board

- Literacy in the financials and operations of the temple
- Comfortable speaking up, disagreeing, challenging issues but then fully supportive of final decisions outside of the room
- Committed, passionate advocacy for Temple Sinai as an institution, and for its clergy and staff
- Giving . . .
 - Time according to each board member's capacity, interests and expertise
 - Resources (access to services, donors, dollars) according to each board member's capacity, interests, and relationships

Board member engagement

Roles and responsibilities

1. Attendance – Attend and participate in board meetings
2. Literacy – Be familiar with board materials
3. Involvement – Work on a committee, task force, or project
4. Representation – Serve as the board rep at services
5. D'var Torah – Give the D'var Torah one time
6. High Holiday Calls – Participate in the annual phone-a-thon of well wishes to members
7. High Holiday Bimah – Volunteer for bimah duties
8. Giving – Give to the Annual Fund . . . any amount
9. Disclosure of Conflicts – Sign annual statement

Committees and program groups

- Committees and program groups are important avenues for member engagement
- Committee, task force and special project chairs are appointed by the president
- Opportunities 2 times/year for leaders to come together for sharing, collaboration and planning
- A member of the clergy/staff team serves as liaison
- Annual report highlights accomplishments, using the framework of the strategic plan

Financial oversight

Overview

- Board plays an important role in financial management of the temple
- Regular financial reviews provide information about what is going on at a high level
- Planning insures we can afford to accomplish goals consistent with the strategic plan

Finance Committee

- Strategic leadership for financial planning and policies
- Reviews monthly year-to-date financial dashboard and fund reports
- Develops annual budget – it is always a balanced operating budget
- Oversees annual audit and temple investments

Board Oversight

- Reviews monthly financial scorecard – year-to-date, and projected year-end results
- Reviews and approves – budget, audit, proposed policy changes
